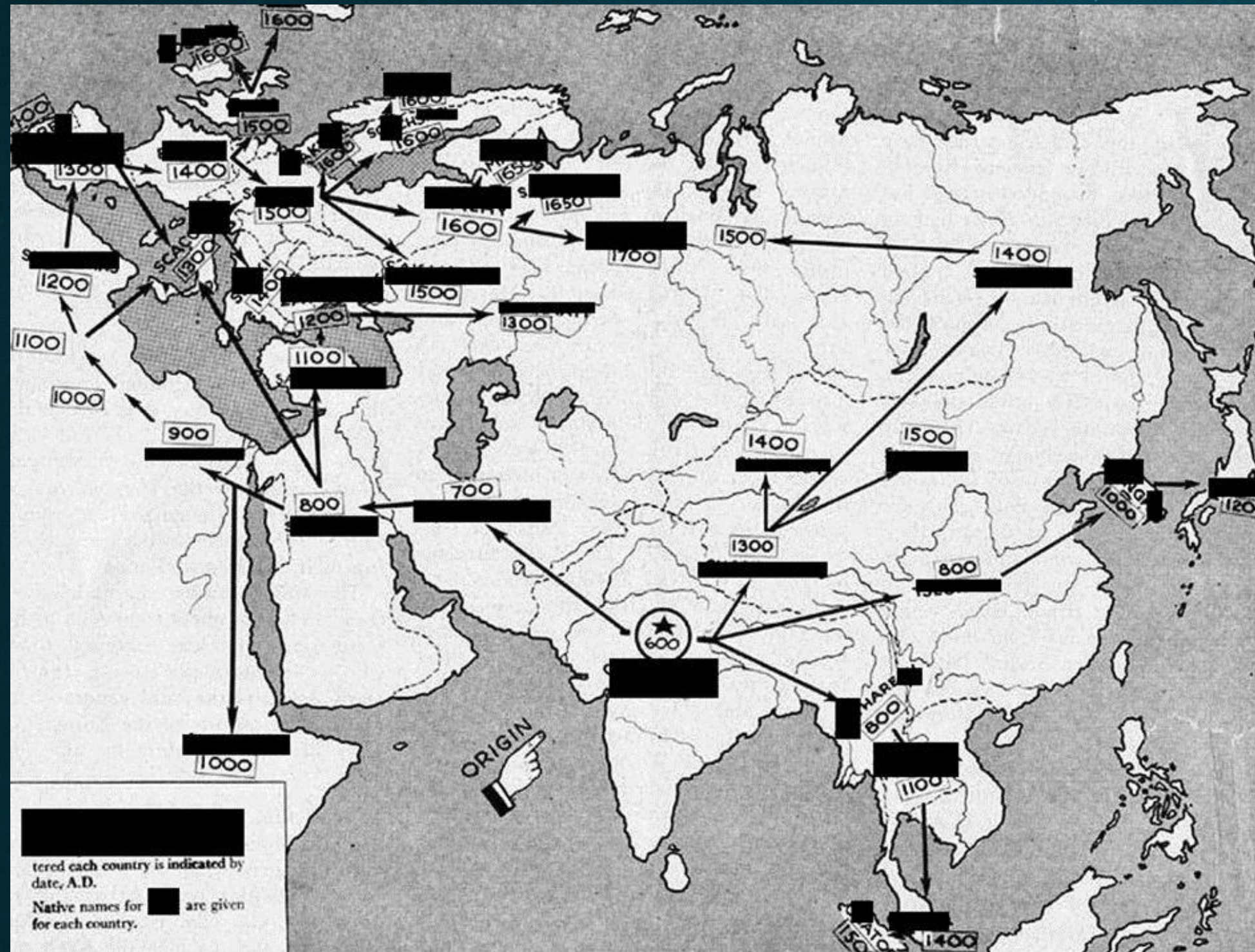

# Charaka Shapath

## 'Charak Shapath' likely to replace Hippocratic Oath in medical colleges

Bengaluru/Ahmedabad: A centuries-old rite of passage for doctors across the world is possibly being given a quiet burial in India, with the home-grown 'Charak Shapath' tipped to replace the Greek-origin Hippocratic Oath in medical colleges from the new academic session starting February 14.

The new oath of choice is an ode to Maharshi Charaka, considered one of the principal contributors to the ancient science of Ayurveda and the author of the medical treatise Charaka Samhita. The undergraduate board of the National Medical Commission (NMC) decided at a meeting with re-

presentatives of medical colleges last week that the oath can be taken in regional languages, too, a source said.

Besides taking the Charak Shapath, all MBBS freshers would need to go through 10 days of yoga training for an hour a day, the source said.

Dr George D'Souza, dean of Bengaluru's St John's Medical College Hospital, said the NMC had informed the college about switching to Charak Shapath, but hadn't published the oath yet. **TOI** couldn't independently confirm if the February 7 meeting highlights being discussed on social media are the official version.

"No Hippocratic Oath. During the White Coat ceremony, the oath will be 'Maharshi Charak Shapath', (as) present in

the NMC website," states the purported highlights of the meeting.

Till Thursday, the text of Charak Shapath was not available on the NMC website.

"Modern medicine has a history of not more than 200 years. Why should we continue to

make doctors take oath in the name of a Greek physician when India has a rich past in medicine? This has been discussed at several of our meetings. It should be a matter of pride to take oath in the name of Maharshi Charaka," said a council member who didn't wish to be identified. The NMC was instituted in September 2020, when it supplanted the Medical Council of India through an act of Parliament.

Indian Medical Association honorary secretary Dr Jayesh Lele said no notification had been received so far. "If the oath is binding on the doctors on ethics and basic principles of the medicine are maintained, then it is fine. As long as doctors are doing ethical practice, we should accept it. Let us

accept the changing times," he said.

Cardiac surgeon Dr Devi Shetty said he endorsed the move, if what's circulating on social media is to be believed. "We should be proud of our ancestry. We have had a tradition of healing for thousands of years. We inherited medical education from the British and we have hardly made any changes since. It's good we will take oath from now in our ancestor's name rather than in a foreigner's name." Hippocrates of Kos was a Greek physician who is believed to have lived from 460 to 375 BC. He believed illness has natural causes and is not due to the wrath of god, going on to build a body of work that made him gain recognition as the father of medicine.

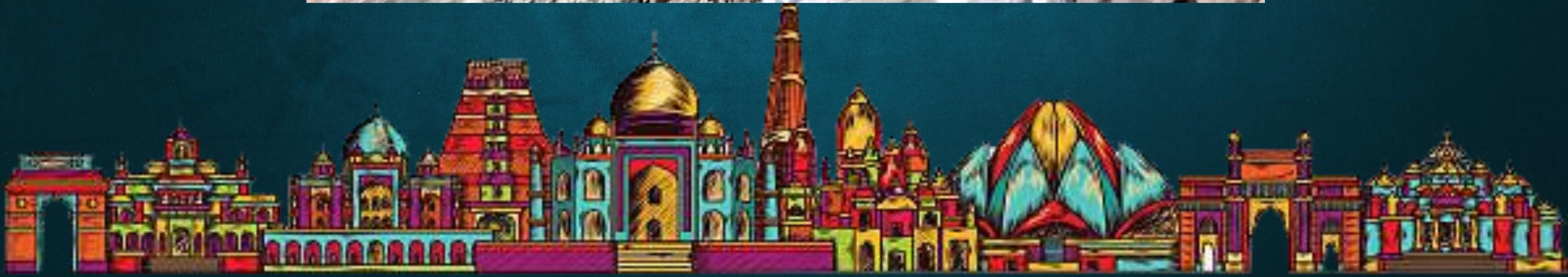

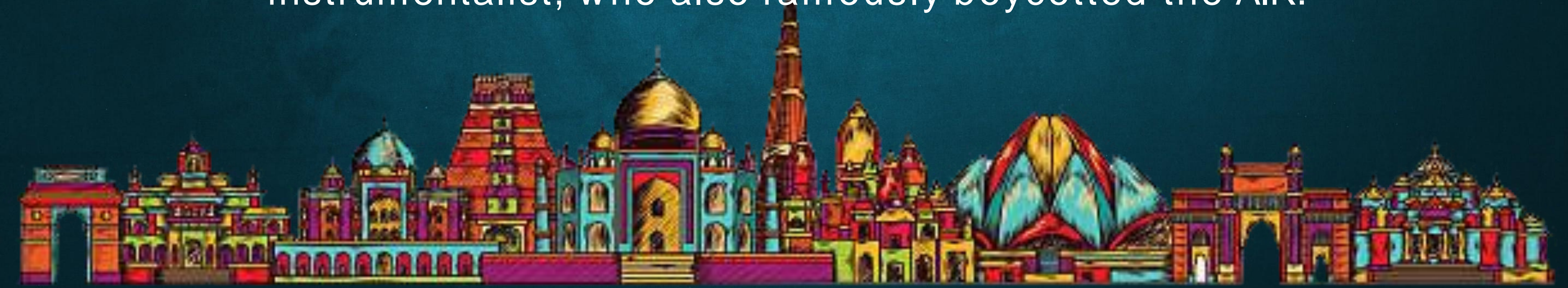
# Question 17
