In keeping with a custom begun by Lincoln in 1863, US presidents had declared a general day of thanksgiving to be observed on the last Thursday in November. Roosevelt moved Thanksgiving to a week earlier to bolster retail sales in America, which was still reeling from the final years of the great depression.
