Q 1). This world cup edition witnessed a number of visible changes in the ODI cricket format. From traditional white jerseys to coloured kits, the adoption of a white cricket ball, and the introduction of daynight matches, this edition changed it all. The Indian cricket team had a poor run throughout the season and were knocked out in the round robin stage itself. Which world cup edition is being referred to?

Q2). X made his first appearance in Tests against Pakistan at Lahore in 1984, X bowled Mohsin Khan with his fifth ball – becoming the third Indian to take a wicket in his first over in Test cricket. In the 1987 Reliance World Cup, X achieved a remarkable feat Y when he clean bowled Ken Rutherford, Ian Smith, and Ewan Chatfield of New Zealand off consecutive ball. Post retirement, X also opened a fast bowling cricket academy in Haryana. Identify X and the monumental feat Y.

Q3.) During the 1983 World Cup, India, who were bamboozled by Zimbabwe's bowling attack and were 9 for 4, witnessed Kapil Dev's miraculous innings, scoring 175 runs. He propelled the team to 266/8, securing victory by 31 runs. Intriguingly, this exceptional innings is remembered only by those present at the stadium, with no recording, footage, or broadcast to authenticate its brilliance. What accounts for this absence?

Q 4). During the 2003 World Cup, the then captain of X and a prominent pace-bowler of the team decided to form a duo and wear black armbands to mark their protests against the famously called "death of democracy" back in their country. The ICC deemed the action as "politically aligned" but did not impose any penalty on the duo. As a result of the protest, the duo was forced to exit X and both of the cricketers later settled in the United Kingdom. Identify team X.

Q5.)In the recent World Cup match between India and the Netherlands, a noteworthy event unfolded, marking India the first team to achieve this milestone in the ODI World Cups. This milestone is also reflected by this scorecard. Which milestone is being talked about?

Q6). India winning the 2011 World Cup Final for the second time was not the only incident on that day to remembered. A rare incident due to the "deafening" Wankhede crowd happened on the field between the captains- MS Dhoni and K Sangakkara before the match started. Which incident is being talked about?

Q7). During the India V South Africa game of the 1999 World Cup, a never-seen-before on field tactic was used by the cricketer X. Sourav Ganguly, who was opening the batting, noticed the tactic by player X and brought it to the attention of umpires. Even though it wasn't technically against the law, player X was asked to not continue with the tactic. X was also involved in one of the biggest cricketing controversies later. Name the cricketer X and the "tactic" which was being used.

Q8). Despite facing local backlash, X was controversially named South Africa's captain for the 1992 World Cup. X is the first player to represent two countries in the history of the format - Australia and South Africa. With apartheid being removed from South Africa in 1991, the International Cricket Council unanimously removed the ban against playing South Africa. As a result of the long ban, 10 of the 11 players of the South African cricket team were making their debuts. X was the eleventh man and the only one who wasn't a debutant. Name X.

Q9.)South Africa and World Cup semi finals is a bitter sweet love story, the closest this love story ever came was a tie in the year 1999, in this particular match, South Africa faced off against Australia and Allen Donald was run out on the very tight score, name the batsman who was on strike and also the player who won the man of the series award in that tournament.

Q10.)During a league match in the 2023 world cup, a team captain appealed for a certain kind of penalty against the batsman of the opposing team which was also the opposing captain. In this controversial appeal, the opposing batsman was declared out without playing even a single delivery. Identify the appealing captain, the opposing captain and the mode of penalty.

Hosted by England and the brainchild of English businessman Sir Jack Hayward, the inaugural X did not have a knockout stage, instead the tournament was played in a round-robin format with the team with the highest points total winning the event. Just like the 21st century, this tournament saw Australia give a spirited performance, but they lost to the winners in the final match of the tournament. Give X.

Q14.) This non - full member nation X had its last ever world cup performance by reaching the semi finals of the 2003 edition. A major reason for the team reaching the semi finals was that another country Y refused to travel to the capital of X due to security concerns, as X was also one of the host nations of this edition. Identify X and Y.

Q15.) The 2023 World Cup campaign for Pakistan was not something to remember except for the amazing run chase against Sri Lanka in which the Pakistani team chased a total of 345 which is now the highest successful run chase in the history of the world cup. The previous record was held by team X against a world cup winning nation Y, and till this day it is considered as one of the biggest upsets in world cup history. identify teams X and Y and also the year in which this run chase was successfully completed.



Q16). X was an English cricket coach, cricketer and a commentator. X played for the England cricket team and later coached South Africa, Warwickshire and Y. During his coaching career with South Africa, he led the team to being the winners of the 1998 ICC Knockout Trophy, the only ICC title ever won by South Africa. During the 2007 World Cup, just a few hours after the unexpected elimination of team Y, X was found unconscious in the team hotel room, to be declared dead subsequently. The local police of Jamaica also opened a murder investigation into X's suspicious death.
