In the twentieth century, Rabindranath Tagore also wrote a title play after X.





What is this colossal floating object?










#### <u>Noah's Ark</u> as the Mt Ararat Anomaly

While the ones who he graciously gave "X' to are said to become great poets and scholars.



Identify Y.





What is X?







Q25. Bhagavad Gita compares Lord Krishna's eyes to  $\underline{A}$  and  $\underline{B}$ . However, <u>A</u> and <u>B</u> are worshipped independently in a set of 9, by Hindus. The Greek counterpart of <u>A</u> is <u>C</u>, who lends his name to a chemical element. The statue of <u>*C*</u> at Rhodes and a temple of <u>*D*</u> at Ephesus, were part of an ancient set of 7. *D* and Khonsu are the respective Greek and Egyptian counterparts of **<u>B</u>**. **<u>D</u>** rose her lover *E* as a constellation after he was killed by her father. Canis minor constellation is sometimes described as a dog of *E* while Egyptians saw it as **F**, their canine God. A component in **E** is identified by Hindus as the wife of **B**.
